Oregon Motorists Urged to Prevent Driving Hazards

Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell Jr., today urged Oregon motorists to prevent accidents by preparing to meet December driving hazards.

Such preparations must include careful checkup of vehicles' running condition and obedience of safe winter driving rules.

"With cars now averaging nine or ten years of age, Oregon's police check showed almost half to be in dangerous mechanical condition," Farrell said. "Lights and brakes—the points most essential to winter safety—were the commonest flaws."

Unequal brakes and bare tires on frosty or icy roads cause many winter skid-wrecks and traffic tie-ups. Failure to have proper lights and clear windshields leads to many accidents stemming from reduced visibility. National Safety Council research points to inadequate traction and poor visibility as the two major causes of winter tragedies on the highways.

December and late November are the most dangerous time of year in a number of respects. With the longest nights, more travel during darkness, the year's worst storms, and three of the year's biggest holidays—Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year—caution is paramount.

"Drive with greater distance between your car and the one in front of you; start early and don't count on making time; beware of frosty spots; and keep your windshield clear," advised Farrell.

Adair Buildings Put Up for Sale To Public By W.A.A.

Navy Rote Applications For 1947 Due Dec. 17

OREGON STATE COLLEGE — Oregon high school students desiring to enroll next fall as regular students in the Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps program at Oregon State college or other institutions with NROTC units were reminded this week that applications for their competitive examinations are due before December 17.

Next fall's quota of regular NROTC students will be selected on the basis of the examinations, according to Captain J. J. Carey, USN, commanding officer of the Oregon State unit. The exams will be given in Oregon at Baker, Bend, Burns, Corvallis, Klamath Falls, Medford, Portland and Salem January 18, 1947.

Regular NROTC students receive tuition, books, fees, and \$600 a year during college. They may take major work at O. S. C. in engineering, agriculture, science, business and industry or pharmacy and are required to take only one course a term in naval science plus two summer cruises and one summer aviation indoctrination. On graduation, they are commissioned as an officer and serve two years on active duty. Information and application forms have been sent to all high school principals.

Home Nursing

Opportunities for women to learn 32 nursing skills from specially trained nurse-instructors, prove valuable in keeping the family's health at a high level and in learning how to prevent the spread of illness if it does come, according to the Red Cross.

These 12-hour courses are given in two-hour discussion-demonstrations, beginning December 2 and 3, with the only charge being 60 cents for the Red Cross Home Nursing textbook, which is kept by those taking the instruction.

Home Nursing is one of the important home crafts, which help to increased home health. Classrooms are equipped just like bedrooms, at the Red Cross headquarters, 1520 S. W. Alder Street.

Advance registration is necessary and can be made by calling AT 8561. A choice of classes is available: from 10 a. m. to 12 noon; from 1 to 3 and from 7 to 9 p. m. As classes are taught twice a week or three times a week, they will be completed before the holidays.

The Red Cross expects to be able to offer classes soon in "Mother and Baby Care." Anyone interested is asked to call the Red Cross and leave her name.

A series of classes for "Expectant Mothers" is also given each week under the sponsorship of the Red Cross and the University of Oregon Medical School, each Friday from 2 to 3 p. m., at the Central Library. No advance registration is needed and as each one-hour period is complete, it is not necessary too attend the full 9-week series.
