Oratorio to Be Given at Auditorium

The Portland premiere performance of Johann Sebastian Bach's greatest choral work, the "Christmas Oratorio" is scheduled for the Civic Auditorium on Friday, December 20th with the 120 selected voices of the Portland Symphonic Choir plus an impressive line-up of the Northwest's finest professional soloists to assure critics and concert-goers an all-time high in artistry and musical entertainment.

C. Robert Zimmerman, director of the Symphonic Choir, has announced the selection of Louise Tuttle Norcross, soprano; Iris Oakley, contralto; Walter Miesen, tenor; and Mark Daniels, bass, for the solo assignments. Lauren B. Sykes, well known Portland organist, and Margaret Notz Steinmetz, accomplished concert pianist, will serve as accompanists.

Johann Sebastian Bach designed the "Christmas Oratorio" for presentation in six parts; one part for each of six special Christmas days. Common concert usage has, however, divided the entire work in half. It is Part I, or the Feast of Christmas portion, depicting the first three days of the Christmas Festival, that will be presented during the December 20th concert.

In this religious masterpiece the Gospel narrative of the incidents the music glorifies is assigned to the tenor soloist. The narrative is broken with "reflective passages" by voices, choral or solo, representing the persons introduced in the story course.
