Ex-War Prisoners To Meet Jan. 2

Henry Soderberg, head of the
War Prisoners Aid work of the
YMCA during World War II will
be in Portland, January 2nd for a
brief visit with YMCA officials.
Mr. Soderberg is a member of
the YMCA staff in Sweden. He
served as Senior Secretary of the
War Prisoners Aid throughout Eu-
rope from March 1943 until June
1945. Being from a neutral coun-
try, he was related to serving
British and American War camps
in Poland, Germany and Seseia.
In his visits to prisoners of war
camps he visited over 50,000 A-
merican boys furnishing them with
clothing, musical instruments,

books and organizing recreational
facilities for the camps. He be-
came acquainted especially with
officers in Stalagluft 3, Oflog 64,
Stalagluft, 344, Stalagluft 6 and
Stalagluft 4.

A special meeting of ex-war
prisoners is being arranged by
the Portland YMCA on the even-
ing of January 2nd at 7:30 p.m.,
inviting all men of the "Barbed
Wire Legion" to meet with Mr.
Soderberg for the purpose of re-
newing acquaintance with him, and
fellow war prisoners. Relatives
and friends of ex-war prisoners are
urged to pass this invitation or
to notify Mr. T. W. Badley of the
Portland YMCA as to the where-
about of ex-prisoners of war.
