All Set for March of Dimes Campaign

Most of the supplies needed for the annual March of Dimes in Washington county during the last two weeks of January are on hand, County Drive Chairman Reid Cottrell announced this week. Organization for the collection moved forward with the naming of another area chairman.

Mrs. R. E. Christensen will again be in charge of the Scholls Gravel/Grover territory. She will appoint a number of community heads to aid in the collection of funds to combat infantile paralysis. Her territory includes Kinston, Laurel, Buck Heaven, Jacktown, Firdale and Mountain Home.

Upwards of 8,500 fact cards and money holders will be mailed to boxholders in the county at the start of the drive, Cottrell said. Approximately 9,000 school cards will also be sent out. Each of these holds up to 50 cents.

Cottrell plans to attend a meeting of county polio drive chairmen of the state with Basil O'Connor, president of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis in Portland, Saturday, January 4. The national drive will be held January 15-30.

Road-Building Surplus Equipment

Three conveyors, two air compressors, one bituminous distributor for road-building and a crawler-type tractor in poor condition are among the machinery on list No. J-560 offered by Portland War Assets administration.

Two conveyors are the belt transfer type and the other the chain transfer type. The bituminous distributor is mounted on a trailer and equipped with both power oil and centrifugal asphalt pumps. The crawler-type tractor is equipped with a half-yard capacity hydraulic shovel. Closing date for the sale is January 13.

Other current WAA offerings are:

List No. J-459, which includes two cement mixers, two centrifugal pumps and one used caterpillar tractor, has a January 17 closing date.

List No. J-529, consists of miscellaneous industrial equipment, including several types of valves, marine type regulators, a salinity indicator system, thermometers and liquid indicators.

Carrots have joined the list of Oregon abundant foods for January, reflecting the difficulty of marketing a large crop of Willamette valley growers have reported. Also on the list as repeaters from December are potatoes, onions, apples, citrus fruits and juices, and turkeys. The monthly abundant food list is prepared by the state PMA office for distribution to schools taking part in the Oregon school lunch program.

History of 60th Infantry Regiment

Free copies of the official regimental history of the 60th Infantry Regiment, in which a considerable number of Oregon men served during the recent war, will be made available to all members and former members upon request. It was announced today by Governor Earl Snell at the request of the regimental historian.

Director George E. Sandy of the State Department of Veterans Affairs, commenting upon the announcement, said the history "should be a proud testimonial to the men, living and dead, who fought with this colorful regiment."

The nearest of kin of men who were killed in action with the 60th regiment are also entitled to receive free copies, the governor said.

Those who wish copies of the history are asked to write to: Regimental Historian, 60th Infantry, APO 9, care Postmaster, New York, New York.

Governor Snell urged that all Oregonians eligible to receive the free histories write for them.

Agents to Study Poultry

A poultry school for county 4-H club agents of western Oregon will be held at O.S.C. on January 16 and 17. Purpose of the event is to give the agents the latest available information concerning poultry production practices to guide 4-H poultry club members in the coming year, says Noel Bennion, extension poultry specialist. Topics to be covered include part-time farmers and the 4-H poultry program, brooding and rearing, breeds and breeding, judging and culling, feeds and feeding, and poultry diseases.

VA Moves To Increase Hospital Bed Space

A new program to make more beds available in Veterans Administration hospitals is now underway, the VA has announced. VA hospital managers are being authorized to furlough patients whose treatment can be completed adequately out of the hospital, thereby making additional beds available to new patients.

Procedures will differ for service-connected and non service-connected disability cases. Veterans with service-incurred disabilities who are sufficiently improved to warrant release will be discharged and will receive outpatient treatment in other VA facilities or on a fee basis "as circumstances warrant." Transportation for this treatment may be furnished at government expense. Non service-connected cases will be granted leaves of absence from the hospitals but will continue to be carried on hospital rolls as patients. They will report for treatment in VA hospital clinics or field stations but will be ineligible for transportation costs at government expense. The VA emphasized that the program will apply only to those

patients whose actual period of hospitalization may be shortened by this method, without prolonging treatment or impeding recovery.

No Report Required On National Guard Pay

Veterans in training who are required to report on earnings other than their subsistence need not list National Guard pay, the Veterans Administration says.

A recent ruling exempts the drill pay from \$175 and \$200 ceilings on combined earnings and subsistence which congress imposed on veterans in training under the G. I. Bill. A ruling is expected shortly on whether Naval Reserve and other reserve training pay should be included in Veterans' earnings reports.

Questions of the Week

Q. How long will I be able to carry the World War II National Service Life Insurance that I bought in service?

A. National Service Life Insurance is issued originally upon the 5-year level premium term plan, which was extended three years for all policies issued before January 1, 1946. However, veterans have the privilege of conversion after one year from date of issue to permanent plans. The law provides that all level premium term policies shall terminate at the expiration of the term period unless exchanged for permanent policies on or before the expiration date. If term insurance has been converted, it remains in effect as long as the premiums are paid.

Q. May I claim my husband as a dependent in my income tax report even though he is receiving compensation for disability incurred while in the service during World War II?

A. A veteran's compensation or pension is not subject to federal income tax. Therefore, if you are the family breadwinner you may claim exemption for him.
