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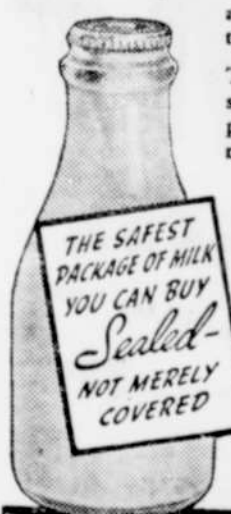

A. N. Wetterborg Serves 38 Years With Tel & Tel Co.

Alfred N. Wetterborg of S. W. Birchwood Drive went to work for the last time Friday, January 10, though his official retirement day is January 31.

Mr. Wetterborg has worked in the telephone department of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, Portland, for over 38 years, having begun August 1908, and worked continuously except for three months in 1917.

In talking with him we learned that collections were first made on foot, or with horse and buggy, just carrying the money in their pockets, even though collections were made from business firms and private homes. There were very few calls to make and not a very great distance to cover, because telephones were only installed where there seemed to be a great emergency.

Later, the territory was covered by bicycle, and now, of course, by car even though collection is no longer made by personal call at the private homes. The area now covered extends from West Slope, Garden Home, Oregon City, Burlington, Oswego, to near Gresham and Troutdale.

The business offices were in the Columbia Building only when Mr. Wetterborg first worked for the firm. Now they occupy the Telephone Co. building as well as certain floors in the Oregon, Commerce and Maegly Tishnor buildings of Portland.

Wetterborg will not be at a loss for something to do. There are so many things he and Mrs. Wetterborg have planned for their home and grounds. Then too, he is very active in Cub and Boy Scout activities in Beaverton and Raleigh Hills, as well as giving a great deal of his time to community drives, such as Red Cross, and Community Chest.
