Save Money Drive Carefully

An auto accident costs the average victim over \$500 if he is a car owner. It has been disclosed by Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell Jr.

Unearthed by the National Conservation Bureau in a study in Lansing, Michigan, the cost figures are being given wide circulation throughout the country. It is believed the Lansing costs are typical.

The research report says the average accident victim loses \$170 in salary, pays \$92 in doctor and hospital bills plus \$26 miscellaneous, and—if he is the car owner—is stuck with a \$220 repair bill. It was stressed that these figures are an average from all accidents and that no attempt was made to "load" them so as to look larger.

"Five hundred dollars is a stiff jolt to any man's pocketbook," said Farrell. "The great value of this report is that it shows how hard each individual is hit by accident losses, rather than referring to the gigantic national totals."

Because of Oregon's high pedestrian toll, the secretary of state also cited a line of the report reading: "Injured pedestrians pay on the average \$468." Fatal accidents averaged an immediate cost of \$1830.
