High School Seniors To Apply for College Early

High school seniors planning to enter college next fall at any of the state system institutions have been advised to make application immediately submitting their record up to the present semester. Instructions for doing this have been sent to all high schools by the high school relations committee of the system headed by E. B. Lemon, dean of administration at Oregon State College.

Reason for the early applications, according to Dean Lemon, is that applications from former students and returned service men are already piling up so rapidly that there is danger that this year's high school graduates will find the institutions filled to capacity if they wait until the usual time to apply for admission.

After seniors are accepted tentatively on the basis of records thus far, they can "validate" their admission by submitting a supplementary record of actual graduation from high school.

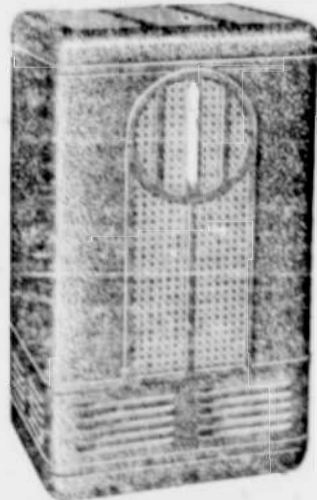
