NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That the City Council of the City of Beaverton, Washington County, Oregon, has called a special election to be held on the 11th day of March, 1947, within the corporate limits of the City of Beaverton and a special election to be held on the same date within the territory hereinafter described sought to be annexed, at which election there will be submitted to the electors of the City of Beaverton and to the electors within said territory the question of whether the following described contiguous territory shall be annexed to and become a part of the City of Beaverton, Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the center of County Road No. 1232, also known as Menlo Drive, which point is the most westerly, southwesterly corner of the City of Beaverton; thence easterly along the southerly boundary of the City of Beaverton to a point in the center of Erickson Avenue; thence southerly following the boundary of the City of Beaverton to a point where it intersects the southerly boundary extended easterly of Berthold's Addition to Beaverton, a plat of record in Washington County, Oregon; thence westerly along the southerly boundary extended, the southerly boundary, and the southerly boundary extended westerly of the said Berthold's Addition to a point in the center of County Road No. 1232; thence northerly along the centerline of County Road No. 1232 to the point of beginning.

The electors shall vote for annexation or against annexation whichever shall indicate their choice.

The polling place within the City of Beaverton will be at the City Hall, and the polling place within said territory sought to be annexed shall be at vacant house marked "Polling Place" located on North Side Hazel Avenue and the polls shall be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that sealed bids will be received by the undersigned until the hour of 8 o'clock P.M., the 13th day of March, 1947, and immediately thereafter publicly opened by the District School Board of Union High School District No. 10 Jt. Washington and Multnomah Counties, at Beaverton Union High School Building, in the City of Beaverton, Oregon, for an issue of bonds of said district in the sum of Three Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00), said bonds to be in denominations of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, dated April 1, 1947, and maturing serially in numerical order at the rate of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) on the 1st day of April in each of the years 1949 to 1961 inclusive; provided however, that all bonds which mature after April 1, 1952, shall be subject to call and redemption on any interest paying date after April 1, 1952; said bonds to bear interest at the rate of not to exceed three per cent (3 per cent) per annum, payable semiannually, principal and interest payable at the fiscal agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, or at the office of the County Treasurer of Washington County, Oregon, at the option of the successful bidder.

All bids must be accompanied by a certified check for Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and must be unconditional. Bonds will not be sold for less than par value and accrued interest.

The approving legal opinion of Messrs. Winnfree, McCulloch, Shuler and Sayre will be furnished the successful bidder.

Reports on HB

HB 118--Vet. Loan Act

HB 118 as prepared by Rep. J. O. Johnson, of Washington County, amending the Veterans' Loan Act, provides for loans up to \$5,000, except loans guaranteed under provisions of title 3 of Public Law 346, in which case loans may be granted not to exceed \$10,000.

The bill also provides that the director of veterans' affairs shall, upon approval of the board of control, sell, assign and transfer notes and mortgages when the total volume of loans exceeds \$3,000,000, preference in assignment being given to lending institutions in the State of Oregon in the locality in which the loan is made. The purpose of the above provision is to prevent the State of Oregon from building up a big institution and yet permit the state to have a sufficient volume of loans to operate a properly managed department at a profit, based upon the present interest now being paid on bonds of approximately one per cent.

The bill does not require veterans to submit a letter from lending institutions, stating that the G. I. loan will not be made by the institution as provided by the senate bill. Such provision will be strenuously opposed by most veterans.

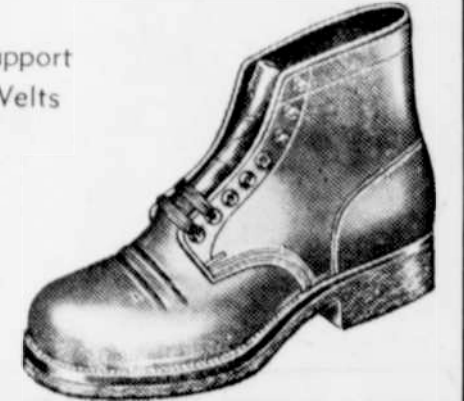
