

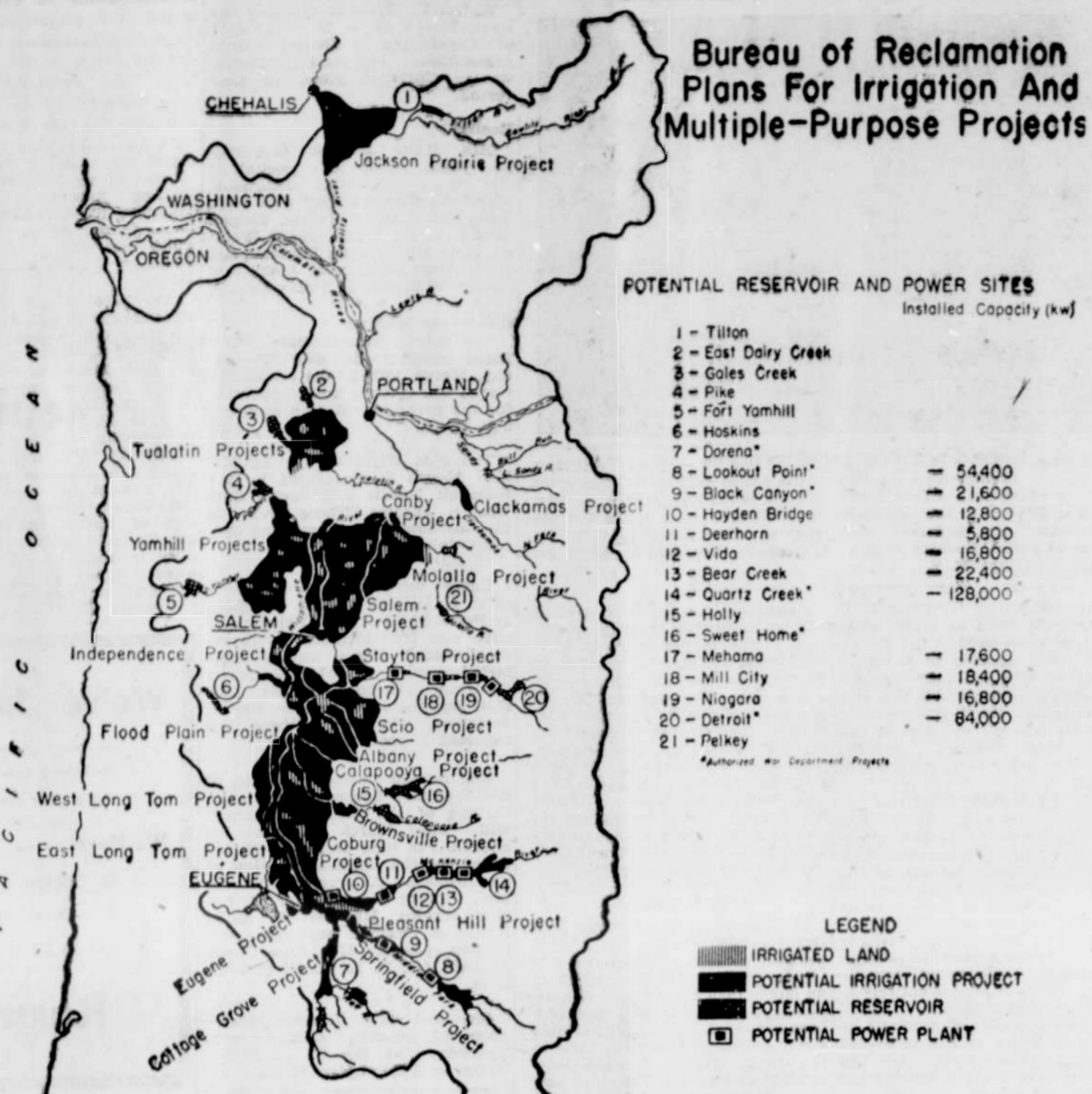
### 4-H Garden Contest for 1847

Potential irrigation and multiple-purpose projects in the Willamette Valley and the Cowlitz River basin which would bring under irrigation 514,000 acres of land and make available 413,000 kilowatts of hydroelectric power capacity are included in the Department of the Interior's comprehensive plan for the development of land and water resources of the Columbia River

and tributaries. The study, prepared by the Bureau of Reclamation, constitutes the first broad plan worked out for the most beneficial use of water and other resources of the Nation's second largest river. Estimated to cost \$273,400,000 at 1940 prices, the possible developments in the area shown above would involve 23 irrigation plants, and 21 new reservoirs.

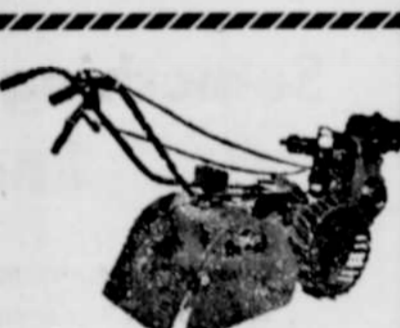

### Gardening Skill To Repay Youths In U. S. Contest

Oregon boys and girls can wield their hoes and use their gardening skill in 1947 to win trip awards or scholarships in contests offered by the National Junior Vegetable Growers association.

Announcement of the seventh annual NJVGA production and marketing contest has been made by Prof. Grant B. Snyder of Massachusetts State College, junior growers' adult advisor. The contest offers \$6,000 in A & P Food Stores' awards. Youths 14 to 21 throughout the United States and enroll now through their club leaders, 4-H club agents, and instructors in vocational agriculture, or directly through Professor Snyder at Amherst, Mass.

New sponsorship for the junior growers' annual demonstration contest has been supplied by David Burpee of the W. Atlee Burpee seed company of Philadelphia. The Burpee awards will consist of trips to the NJVGA convention in December for those who score highest in state demonstration contests.

Oregon winners in 1946 in the production and marketing contest included the Western States champion George Grenz of Albany who received a \$200 scholarship. Scholarships of \$100 each were won by Marjorie Zeller of Brockway, and Lynn Haefner of Albany.

Prof. A. G. Bouquet of Oregon State College at Corvallis is chairman of the Western States scholarship committee for NJVGA.

**Registration Leadership**  
Continuing its war-interrupted record of annual automotive sales leadership, Chevrolet in 1946 led all other makes in U. S. automotive registration. This record, which in Detroit by the complete tabulation for the entire nation for the full year of 1946. This record, which includes both passenger car and truck registrations, gives Chevrolet an impartial rating upon which to base its claim of national passenger car sales leadership in 11 out of the past 12 production years according to T. H. Keating, general sales manager of this largest General Motors division.

With final reports tabulated on March 1, including car and truck registrations, Chevrolet totaled 501,219, a figure that is 42,928 units greater than any other make in the industry, Keating said. Passenger cars accounted for 329,601 units; trucks for 171,618.

Chevrolet's showing, Keating asserted, is especially significant in view of the fact that in the first three months of the year the division was strike-bound and non-productive.

A clean sweep was scored by Chevrolet in December, outregistering all other makes in every state, Keating said. Final accounts show that Chevrolet led in passenger car registrations by 2,779 units, in trucks by 40,149.

Registration figures, Keating pointed out, represent the final impartial standard of automotive leadership and are eyed as keenly by the industry as are election returns by the candidates involved.

Chevrolet already has announced production and sales records for the year, it was recalled, and with the 1946 registration leadership paves the way for a postwar cycle of industry dominance that spans the war years and continues its cumulative record of having led the industry in 10 of the 11 immediate prewar years.
