1946 PRICE SUPPORTS TO END

The end of this month marks the close of operations under price support programs for most 1946-crop commodities, Oregon producers are reminded by E. Harvey Miller, state PMA chairman. Commodity loans on wheat, barley and potatoes mature April 30, and borrowers will need to repay their loans by that date or make delivery of the commodity, Miller said. The purchase program for winter cover crop seeds also closes on April 30.

Loans have been made to Oregon producers on 1,755,000 bushels of wheat, 21,000 bushels of barley and 1,800,000 hundredweight of potatoes. About 12,300,000 lbs. of common ryegrass and 1900 pounds of hairy vetch have been purchased.

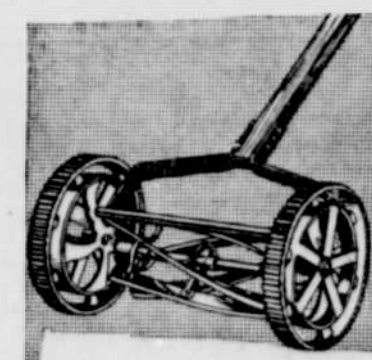
