## THIS WEEK'S TASTE TEMPTER

### Bean and Round Steak Casserole

submitted by Mrs. C. A. Walters of Brentwood Avenue

1 cup dried beans, soaked and cooked  
1 pound round steak, browned and stirred until crumbly  
1 can tomato soup  
1 cup water  
Bacon slices—broiled or fried lightly  
Raw onion slices  
Brown sugar

Mix together the first four ingredients, arrange in buttered casserole. Alternate layers and beans and round steak with layers of bacon, onions and brown sugar. Top with a light sprinkling of brown sugar and bake at 350 degrees for one hour. This makes an ideal picnic dish for it may be made ahead of time and reheated, or served cold. It will serve 6 or 8.

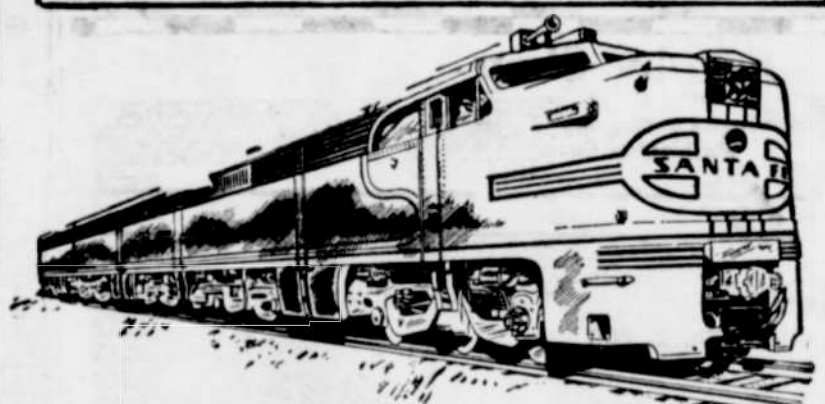
