DOWN CAKE

Melt together in a skillet: 1 cup brown sugar 1/2 cup butter on margarine Place in fruit when this mixture is melted and mixed. Fruit may be pineapple, apricots, peaches, or any other slightly tart fruit.

For the cake part, beat: 3 eggs until thick Gradually beating in 1 cup sugar.

When beaten smooth add 1 tablespoon cold water. Beat a little longer.

Add 1 cup of cake flour, which has been thoroughly sifted with 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1-4 teaspoon salt.

Beat until well mixed and pour over fruit. Bake at 350 degrees until cake is firm. When cake is still hot turn it out on serving plate and top with whipped cream.
