This Week's TASTE TEMPTER

LEMON CAKE PUDDING

(Submitted by Mrs. Edward Hargrett of Brentwood Avenue)
1 cup sugar
1-4 cup flour
1-4 teaspoon salt
2 eggs
1-4 cup lemon juice
1 grated lemon rind
1 cup milk

Mix sugar, flour, salt, add well beaten egg yolks, add lemon and rind, and add milk slowly. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour in baking dish which has been set in pan of cold water. Bake for forty minutes at 350 degrees. Serve with whipped cream. Orange juice and rind may be substituted for the lemon if desired. This serves four generously.

Harry Mair who purchased the MacDonald rabbitry has added some more fine pedigreed does to his herd.

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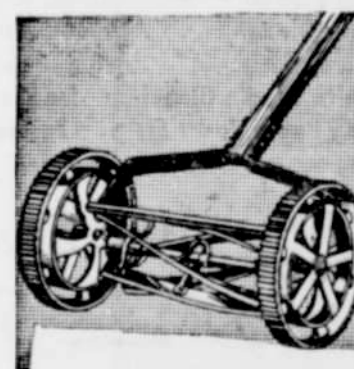
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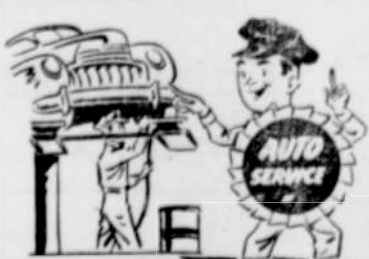
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AWAY FROM HOME
