The children had a wonderful time.

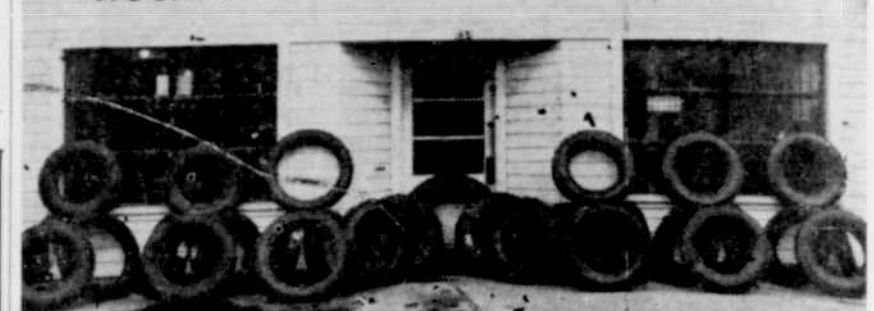
PROMOTION
