HEALTH DISTRICT FORMED

The Washington - Yamhill Health District was officially formed on July 16, 1947 at a joint meeting of the two county courts held in the County Court House at McMinnville. A resolution was adopted by both courts signifying their willingness to form a Health District and Rules and By-laws were also adopted. Judge H. D. Kerkman of Washington County was elected Chairman of the Board and Judge H. M. Hoskins of Yamhill County was elected vice-chairman. Doctor Hollister M. Stoltz was elected secretary of the Board and District Health officer.

Under the new law the District Board of Health is required to meet at least semi-annually to transact business. The budgets of the two counties are approved by the District Health Board and all personnel appointments are subject to approval of the Board.

Washington and Yamhill counties have been jointly cooperating in the sharing of a Health Officer since July 1944 when Doctor F. T. Burke resigned.

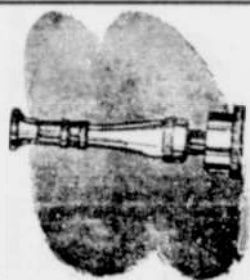

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Answer—FALSE—The Sea Lily is an animal, a form of marine life.

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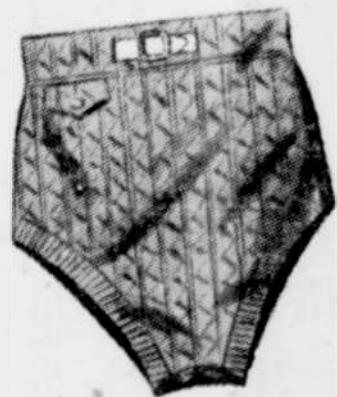
