### AWARD OFFERED FOR 4-H CLOTHING DEMONSTRATION

Special awards for the best 4-H Club clothing demonstration in the state are being sponsored this year by the American Viscose Corporation. Beryl Scothorn has received word that the firm will present \$25 in cash to each of the two state champion individual demonstrators or to each of the two members of the state champion demonstration team on this subject.

Demonstrations may be on any subject relating to the selection and care of clothing. This may include selection of fabrics, washing, drying, ironing, removal of spots or stains, and care of the garments when not in use. State winners must be 14 years of age or older, and must have completed at least three years of 4-H work including the current year.

Washington county has 10 clothing demonstration teams in training for competition at the State Fair this fall.

### "WOOL GROWER'S" CONTEST OPEN TO ALL 4-H GIRLS

The Oregon Wool Grower's Contest is open to all girls who have had clothing IV and V, and will be held at the county fair August 29 in the 4-H building.

Two pieces of cloth will be furnished each contestant, one on light weight woolen material such as wool-crepe and one a heavier piece such as suiting. The contest will be to make two kinds of seams in woolen material and two kinds of hems in the same materials.

The winner will enter the same contest held at Salem during the State Fair in September. State awards will be—1st prize \$10 and 2nd, \$5.

The public is invited to attend.

### PICK CORN IN AFTERNOON SAY ASS'T COUNTY AGENT

Sweet corn during the late morning or afternoon is sweeter than that harvested early in the morning. That is a timely garden reminder from Ass't County Agent Joe Cox, who explains that sugar is stored in the corn during the day and changes to starch at night.

A second pointer for getting top quality in home grown garden products is to remove the tops from root crops very soon after digging. While in the ground the plant feeds from the soil, but when the plant is dug, the tops draw upon the food stored in the root and thus reduce its value. This applies to all root crops including beets, carrots, turnips, and parsnips for example.

If ground is available in good shape for planting, this is a good time to plant some fall spinach, mustard, turnips, radishes, and lettuce. Cox adds. These are nutritious foods that will be helpful to the family budget later on.

A letter received by Joe Cox from R. Ralph Clark, Extension College comments that gardens are looking very good now in most sections of Oregon. "The gardens which were planted following the wet period in the spring have grown exceptionally fast and are giving good returns for the time and expense involved," Clark says.
