

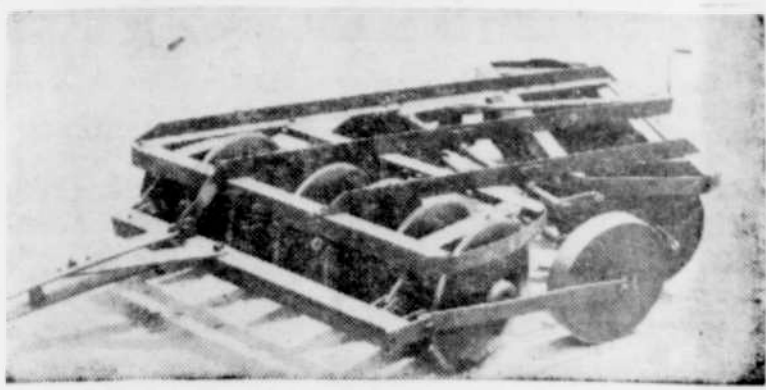
THE CAMPBELLS TRAVEL
