School Building Ready For Action Cafeteria Added

The Beaverton grade school has been completely re-decorated, the walls of the rooms are newly calcolined in green, yellow, tan and white. The floors gleam so that they reflect the squares of the windows. The black boards are black and lustrous with no gray dust to mar their beauty and the clean smell of fresh paint pervades all.

There she waits in all her gleam and polish for the oncoming hordes that will all too soon leave black marks on the floor, dust on the black boards and laughter in the halls.

The cafeteria, to be used for the first time after Sept. 15, that is if all the work is finished by that time, is decorated in pale green and will be under the direction of Mrs. Vedon Boge, who will be the head cook. She will have some help but how much she will need is not known at this time.

Ten big tables and ten smaller ones and chairs to match each line the walls. The floor has just been covered with a new asphalt tile.

The latest in modern equipment has been installed in the kitchen. At the entrance to the cafeteria there are three shelves to hold the trays of the lunchers. The counter has metal gliders on which to slide along the tray to the steam table, which

is protected from pointing fingers with a glass enclosure.

Beyond the steam tables there are counters where the other food can be spread out and at the end of this one long counter is the water tap and glasses. Trays are taken to the tables in the lunch room where lunches are consumed and afterward each person brings his dirty dishes to a window where they are received.

This window opens onto a stainless steel drainboard where the trays which fit into the automatic dish washer are kept. Beyond the dishwater on the south side of the room there is a stainless steel "triple" sink to be used to wash pots and pans.

Next there is a new electric stove with yawning ovens and next to the stove is the house wife's dream, a long, long drain board with cupboards above, the length of it, and in the middle of the drain board a sink to be used for the preparation of vegetable school at 9:15 o'clock, register, get their book and supply lists and then have the rest of the day off.

From this cafeteria many hungry mouths can and will be fed.

School opens on Sept. 8 on which day the four school buses will pick up children in the morning on their regular last year schedules. Pupils will come to school at 9:15 o'clock, register, get their book and supply lists and then have the rest of the day off.

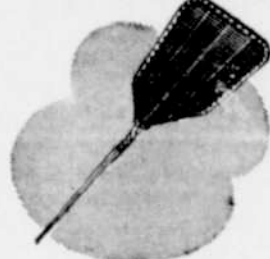
