NOTICE OF OPENING OF NORTH HOCKEN STREET ASSESSMENT

To all owners of lots, tracts or parcels of land hereinafter described:

An urgent need for hop and bean pickers is the cry of the growers.

Due to the opening of the schools and students returning to their school duties necessitates a call to other pickers.

Hop picking will begin September 1, and the rate of pay is not less than 4 cents per pound.

Pole bean pickers will receive 2 1/2 cents a pound.

There is also need for onion and sweet corn pickers, which pays an hourly rate of 75 cents to 85 cents.

If you will contact the Farm Labor office at Hillsboro either in person or by calling Hillsboro 2171, you will receive information as to transportation and where the fields are located.
