2 MILLION FISH IN LAKES

More than 300 high Cascade lakes will have had fish packed to them by the time the season is ended, according to C. A. Lockwood, assistant supervisor for the Oregon State Game Commission.

Approximately 2,000,000 rainbow and eastern brook trout have been allocated for the packing program, the fish being obtained from the Klamath, Fall River and Hood River hatcheries. Two pack strings have been working for several weeks and so far have stocked lakes on Klamath Falls to McKenzie highway. Operations are scheduled to start this week in the Mt. Hood National Forest.

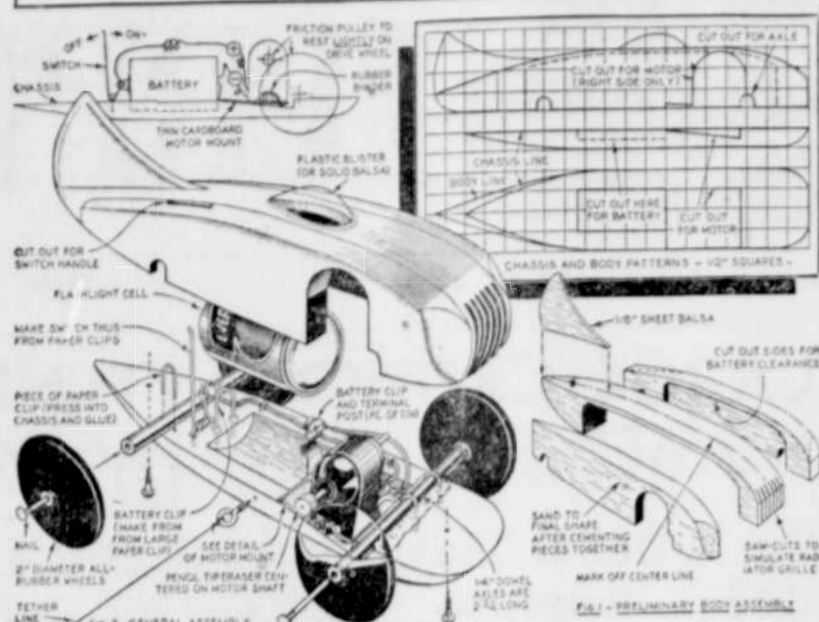

FATHER and SON



MIDGET RACING CAR

Budget: Dad, \$3.00 for motor — Son, 60c for material

Dear Dad:

The Eveready midget racer is easy to build and is not only instructive but provides endless fun for you and your son.

Power is provided by a tiny var surplus electric motor operated by a high energy 19c flashlight cell. The simple friction drive is produced by mounting a piece of pencil-eraser on the motor shaft and mounting the motor flexibly so that it bears down on one of the front wheels without bearing down too hard to stall the motor.

Apart from the motor and the rubber wheels it requires only a few cents worth of balsa, model airplane cement and pigmented dope to build. The rest of the material is from odds and ends found around the house such as paper clips, nails and bits of tin-can.

Also, no special tools are required; pieces of razor blade and sandpaper will be found sufficient if soft balsa is used.

It is not even necessary to employ soldering. All electrical connections can be made fast with glue. First lay out full-size patterns of the body and chassis from the plans given. Cut out the chassis as shown and construct the body as shown in Fig. 1. After body is glued together and dry, pin it temporarily to the chassis and sand the entire assembly down to stream-line shape.

Fig. 2 shows the general assembly of all parts after the chassis and body pieces have been built. Make certain the battery makes proper contact at its terminal points, oil axles liberally and motor sparingly and the model is ready for testing. Paint to suit. Fasten body to chassis with two small screws as shown in Fig. 2.

By lengthening the body to permit the use of two batteries in series much greater speeds can be obtained but wheel size should not be decreased as the gear ratio given is correct for the motors recommended.
