

Vets, Natl. Guard Stand By To Give War Dead Honors

The Oregon National Guard and leading veterans' organization through the state are standing by to assist with military honors for Oregon's returning World War II dead, the State Department of Veterans Affairs learned today.

Inquiries by the veterans' department disclosed that firing squads have been formed by these organizations in local communities to be at the call of next of kin who desire military rites for the burial of those now returning to their native soil.

In addition to these, the U. S. Marine Corps and U. S. Army recruiting stations, and the Oregon military district organized reserve are prepared to render service to next of kin in the Portland area.

Families of the deceased have been notified in every case, however, that funeral arrangements will be as they desire, and they may or may not have military rites, just as they choose. Contact for further information should be made with a Legion or VFW post in local communities.

Firing squads ranging from four to eight men and a bugler have been formed in many communities by either the Legion or the VFW.

The Oregon National Guard headquarters in Salem has issued an order to its units in Portland, Astoria, Tillamook, Forest Grove, McMinnville, Salem, Eugene, Roseburg, Medford, Grants Pass, Baker, Milton-Freewater and La Grande to give full military honors when requested. National Guard units being organized at Corvallis, Ashland, Klamath Falls, Coos Bay and Coquille also will be ready to assist in the near future, it was disclosed.

A specially trained military escort is accompanying each body to its destination, and is contacting next of kin to help arrange burial details.

STATE TAX ROLLS FORECAST RECORD HIGHER THAN 1944

Oregon's pay rolls for the first half of 1947 reached new heights, with employment greater than for any period except the 1943-44 war-time peak, according to reports from more than 15,000 covered employers just tabulated by the State Unemployment Compensation Commission.

In calling attention to more than \$100 millions in wages paid up to June 30, T. Morris Dunne, Commission Chairman, observed that complete 1947 reports probably would be well over the former record of \$799 millions for 1944.

"Third and fourth quarter pay rolls usually are materially higher than for the first half of the year, and 1947 will be no exception, judging from preliminary employment reports from hundreds of representative firms all over the state," said Dunne.

"We now have about 4,000 more subject employers than on V-J Day and every like of business has been benefited. The number of new firms still is on the increase. They have absorbed thousands of veterans and shipyard workers, making pay rolls even greater than during war-time."

Average covered employment for the last half of 1947 is estimated by the commission to run from 5 to 10 per cent higher than the 290,363 average for the first half. Last year the number


