**Farm Group  
Asks Safer Roads**

More attention to the Tualatin Valley Highway, particularly where shoulders have worn away from the pavement to make for traffic danger, is asked by the Washington County Unit of the Farmers Educational and Cooperative Union of America. Lyman E. Ross, of Aloha, is president of the unit.

The resolution reads: WHEREAS—There have been many accidents on the Tualatin Valley Highway during the past few months, in which several fatalities have occurred and many others which caused severe injuries and property damage, directly caused by the shoulders of the highway being worn away from the pavement effecting control of their cars by the drivers; AND WHEREAS—The Tualatin Valley Highway between West Slope and Forest Grove is heavily overloaded;

AND WHEREAS—It is the responsibility of the State Highway Department to keep the highways in a good and safe state of repair.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED—By the Washington County Farmers Union this 27th day of September, 1947, that we request the State Highway Department to keep said highway in a better and more safe state of repair, and especially to keep the shoulders level with the pavement and free from ruts and obstructions.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED—That we request the Highway Department to immediately proceed with definite plans to widen said highway and make such improvements as will adequately take care of the travel in a safe and efficient manner. Unanimously adopted Sept. 27, 1947
