NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That at the school district bond election hereby called to be held at the Beaverton Grade School, Beaverton, Oregon, in and for School District No. 48 of Washington County, Oregon, on Monday, the 19th day of January, 1948, between the hours of 2:00 p. m. and 7:00 p. m. there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$240,000 for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing, improving, repairing, equipping, and furnishing school buildings and additions thereto in and for said school district.

The vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bonds—Yes" and "Bonds—No," and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the word "Bonds" and the word "Yes," or between the word "Bonds" and the word "No," whichever indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contraction of said indebtedness will, on said day and date and at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of 2:00 p. m. and remain open until the hour of 7:00 p. m. of the same day, at which hour the same shall be closed.

sonnel who failed to receive honorable discharges to apply for review of their cases. All discharges other than honorable, except those issued as the result of general courts martial, are eligible for review. Types of Navy discharges issued were those "under honorable conditions," "undesirable," "bad conduct," and "dishonorable."

Men in these cases received the less desirable discharges up until Jan. 10, 1946, when Coast Guard regulations were changed to permit issuance of standard honorable discharges, retroactive to Dec. 7, 1941. Those so affected need only make application to the Commandant, Coast Guard Washington 25, D. C.
The other branches of the service—army, navy and marines—apparently have issued no such instructions, officials told the state veterans' agency. Men of these branches with ordinary or "under honorable conditions" discharges for similar reasons should write their respective branches and ask for a review in order to obtain the standard honorable discharges.
Recently the Navy invited all ex-Navy and marine corps per-

sonnel who failed to receive honorable discharges to apply for review of their cases. All discharges other than honorable, except those issued as the result of general courts martial, are eligible for review. Types of Navy discharges issued were those "under honorable conditions," "undesirable," "bad conduct," and "dishonorable."

Ex-Navy men should write to Bureau of Naval Personnel, Washington 25, D. C. Marines should write: Commandant, U. S. Marine Corps (Personnel Department), Headquarters, Washington 25, D. C. Ex-army men should write the Adjutant General, Department of Army, Washington, 25, D. C.

In all cases the veteran should write his full name, rank held at time of discharge, serial number, and type of discharge. If a court martial was involved, information should also include date and number of the court martial order.
