KITCHEN MEMO

HE-MAN favorite, and for most women too, is any dish with Sauerkraut. This recipe uses Beef Brisket—a good item for price-conscious cooks and a pleasant change from the usual frank or spareribs combination...

Deep fat frying isn't too complicated a cooking process if you remember that it's most important to maintain even heat. Keeping the flame at correct heat also saves waste of food and fat. Fat that gets too hot can't be used more than once or twice.

If you have recently bought a new gas range, particularly one built to "CP" standards, remember that the oven preheats faster than older models and needs less gas to keep fixed oven temperature.

Fudge won't boil over if butter is rubbed around the top of the pan.

A change from the usual cereal for breakfast, and nourishing too, is French toast. It's a saving use for stale bread usually thrown out. Dip stale bread slices in an egg and milk mixture, fry same as pancakes over medium low heat.
