Thurlow Weed Runs For Office Of Beaverton J. P.

Thurlow Weed, local practicing attorney, has announced his intention to seek the office of justice of the peace for the Beaverton district should that office not be abolished by the county court.

In announcing his candidacy, Weed states: "If elected justice of the peace, I pledge that I will resign the office upon the establishment of a district court by the legislature which will take over the judicial duties of the justice of the peace courts, an argument advanced for the abolishment of justice of the peace court is that, the offices often are held by men untrained in the law. I am a graduate of Oregon State College and of Northwestern College of Law and have been a member of the Oregon Bar since 1934."

Weed's name will not be a new one on election ballots. In 1938, he sought the Republican nomination for short-term United States senator. In that race he ran second, losing by less than 5,000 votes to Alex Barry, who was elected U. S. senator in the following general election. In 1940, Weed placed second in a field of candidates for national Republican committeeman for Oregon. Expense accounts filed with secretary of state disclosed that 25 times the sum expended for and by Weed had been expended by and for the elected committeeman.

From June 12, 1942 to March 2, 1946, Weed served as an enlisted man and officer in the army air force.
