### CIRCLE 2 CHANGE

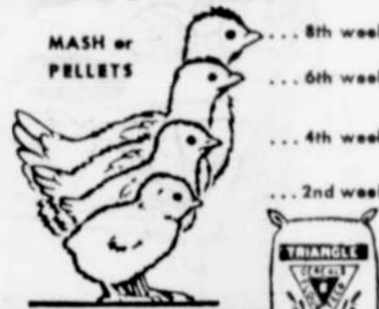
