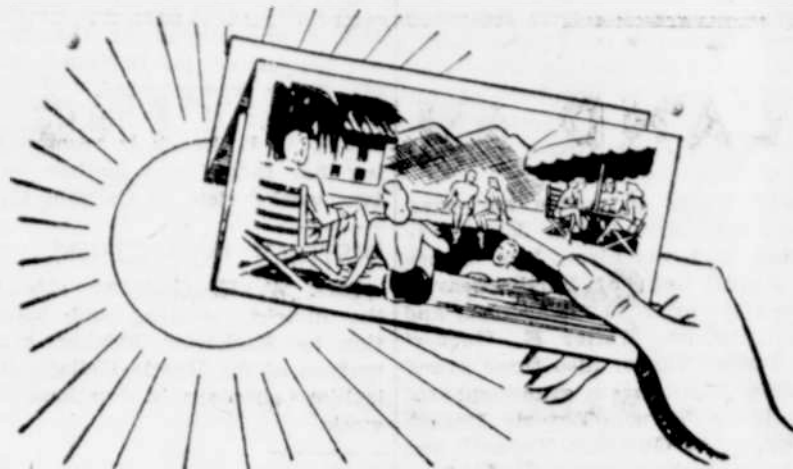


FANTASY BROADCAST

Doctor Johnson's Animal Hospital Service Expands

With extensive alterations about completed, Doctors Norman E. Johnson and R. E. Koenig have expanded facilities with which to care for sick or diseased animals and pets. The Johnson veterinary hospital is located on Canyon road, east of the Beaverton "Y".

Entering the re-arranged set-up, a patron goes into a well-arranged waiting room which is tastefully decorated with fireplace and all.

First room is fitted out for examination of patients. Adjoining is a pharmacy where necessary medical supplies are kept.

Another room provides for laboratory tests to determine the occurrence of Bangs disease in cattle, for instance, or various cat and dog diseases. Advantages of X-ray and fluoroscopy are also provided.

Surgical treatments are made in a separate room and there is another space for less technical treatment.

To prevent the spread of infection of communicable cat and dog diseases, there is an isolation ward, which will be closed off from contact with other parts of the building.

In the hospital wards, new kennels have been put in place and there is also an adjoining out-doors kennel run.

Latest methods for setting animal fractures with stainless steel pins and for blood transfusions will now be employed by the Beaverton veterinarians.

A separate portion of the hospital has been set aside for the boarding, bathing and clipping of cats and dogs. Equipment is also available for dental work on animals when required.

Substitute Clerk Or Carrier Jobs At Beaverton P.O.

Jobs of substitute clerk or substitute carrier, for the United States post office service have been announced at Beaverton, and anyone wishing further information is requested to apply to J. L. McKeel, secretary of the board of U. S. Civil Service examiners at the Beaverton post office.

These jobs are temporary but they may lead to permanent classified civil service status, at Beaverton.

No specific experience or education is required. Applicants will take a written examination which includes a sorting test, general test and a following-instruction test. Also, applicants must reside within delivery limits of the Beaverton post office, or be bona fide patrons of the office.

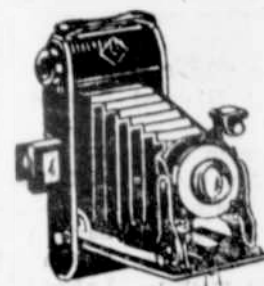
