Former National Leader Spanish War Vets Speaks

Hon. Scott Leavitt, past national commander of the Spanish War Veterans and for many years United States senator from Idaho, was the featured speaker, February 14, at a joint meeting of the Beaverton and Hillsboro camps of the United Spanish War Veterans, and their auxiliaries. The meeting honored the memory of 266 men who lost their lives, 50 years ago, in the sinking of the battleship Maine. The program followed a covered dish luncheon at noon.

Mr. Leavitt now resides in Oregon and is at present the district governor of Rotary clubs of Oregon and Washington. His address brought out the important results that followed the Spanish-American war and its effect upon the individual, the United States and the world at large.

Until the year 1898, the United States had been under the shadow of the great empires of Europe. But the events which followed that date established our country's leadership in righting the wrongs of oppressed peoples, not alone in Cuba but in the islands of Puerto Rico and the Philippines.

The United States had long been in sympathy with the efforts of Cuba to free itself of Spanish despotism. But the sinking of our battleship Maine in Havana harbor where it was anchored at a post designated by the authorities, was the spark that incited the American people to action.

The famous race of the battleship Oregon to join the Atlantic fleet, to help in the destruction of the Spanish fleet, proved the immediate urgency of a short route between the Pacific and Atlantic oceans with resulting construction of the Panama canal.

Another consequence of the Spanish American war was the great interest it created in scientific research to combat yellow
