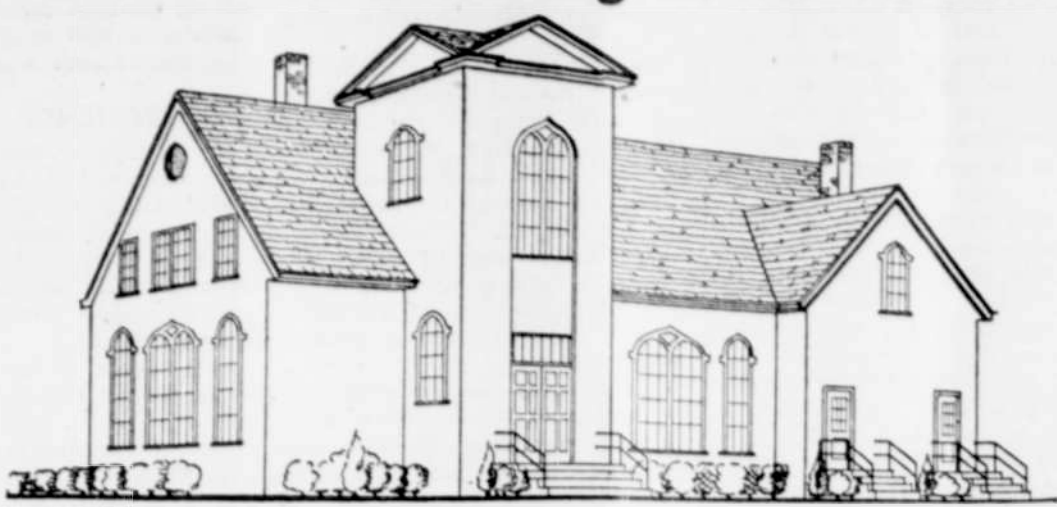

HAVING ACQUIRED a site at the intersection of Watson, Washington and 9th streets, in Beaverton, the Hillsboro district of the Seventh Day Adventists church, Elder G. A. Thompson, pastor, announces it will build a new church as soon as possible and bring a new religious organization into the community.

Ample room for various school and church-society needs is allowed in the plans by architects Clausen and Clausen, Portland, who

made the design. Cost is estimated \$22,000.

Elder G. E. Johnson, who is Thompson's associate in administration of five of the denomination's churches located in Gaston, Cornelius, Hillsboro and Huber, will take over the Beaverton branch when construction is finished.

The sect operates many grade and high schools as well as hospitals, clinics and a class A medical college.
