VACATION ENDS

The pupils of Barnes school have had a three weeks' vacation from Jan. 31 to Feb. 23, because of construction on our school building. A new oil furnace for steam heat was installed. New plumbing was added to both restrooms. New roofing was put on the old part of the building to correspond with the new.

The concrete floor is in the basement of the new building. There is still dirt on the front walk from the hole dug for the oil tank. It has been too wet to remove. A temporary board walk has been built. The tank holds 8,000 gallons of oil. It is 24 feet in length and 7½ feet in diameter. Such a large tank will take care of possible future additions to present school building.
