Church Council Honors Minister Of Local Church

Appointment of Rev. Everett L. Bowers to the Christian Education and Church World Service committees of the Oregon Council of Churches was announced recently by Dr. Gilbert Christian, executive secretary for the council.

Meeting periodically these committees together with 14 others formulate the United Protestant program in Oregon representing the cooperative effort of 16 denominations in our state.

Organized in Portland, Oregon, March 20, 1935 with representatives present from 26 other communities, the council has steadily grown, constantly assuming new and added responsibilities.

Under the able leadership of its president, Dr. Chester W. Hamblin, pastor of Salem's First Presbyterian church, and of its executive secretary, Dr. Christian, the council has this year approved a budget of \$19,550.00 to carry on its work in the following fields: World relief, ministry among the migrants, constructive evangelism, radio, visual education, preaching missions, juvenile protection, annual convention, youth work, women's work, Christian education, legislative committee, United Church promotion, weekday church schools, Sunday school enlargement, organization of local councils, annual town and country leadership institute, bettered race and industrial relations, statewide church planning and strategy and sound temperance education.
