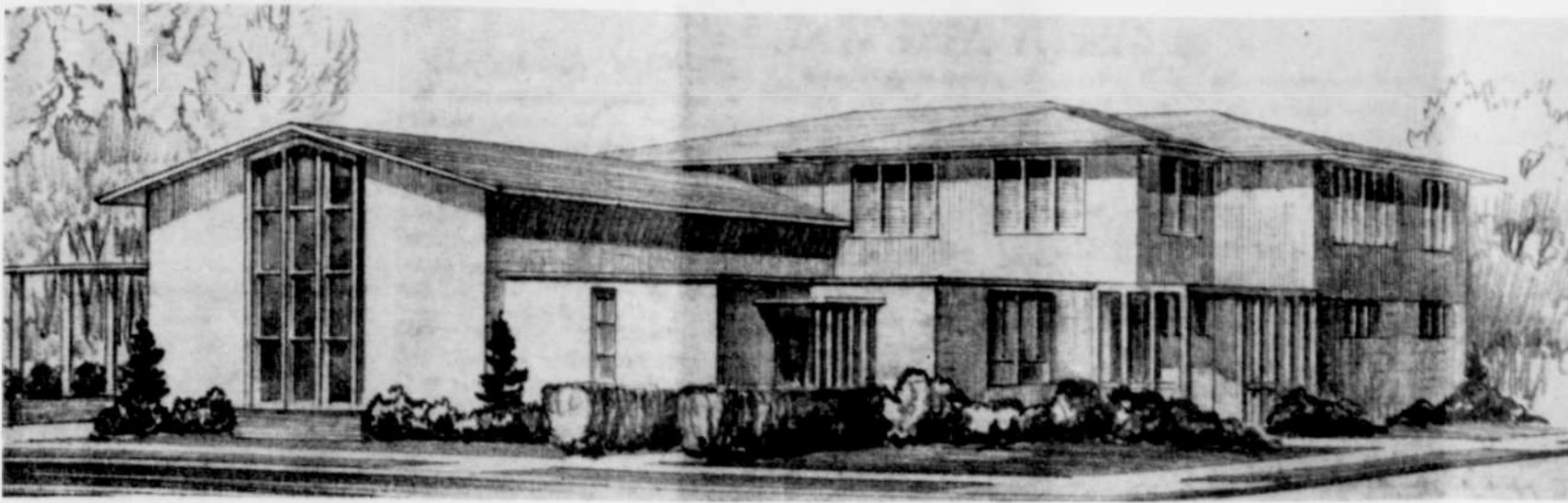


Pegg's New Funeral Chapel Building On 2nd & Watson



OCCUPYING THE LOT on Second and Watson, across from the Masonic temple, Beaverton, Pegg's Mortuary is now building a new funeral chapel. Ground floor will be of pumice block construction with the upper story of verticle white siding.

Chapel will have a vaulted ceiling, with rose glass windows set in deep white frames. The chapel size will be 26 by 65 feet, facing 2nd street.

Public entrance will be at Watson street and the building will set back from the sidewalk enough to allow necessary

landscaping. The entire building will be air-conditioned, both for heating and cooling.

Donald W. Edmundson, designer of the Valley Community Church, Forest Grove school building and church, Cedar Mills Community church and other churches in the state, is serving as architect for the new funeral home. Mr. Edmundson also had served on the planning board of the Beaverton grade school.

The new chapel building marks the completion of 38 years of community service by W. E. Pegg, fulfilling a long cherished ideal.
