## Vanport College Loss Emphasizes Continued Need

Whereas, the Vanport extension center was originally created in the summer of 1946 by the need for an adequate combination of educational, housing, and employment opportunities for veterans and other students of limited means in Oregon, and

Whereas, the recent complete physical destruction of the Vanport Extension Center has in no way eliminated this continued need but rather has aggravated and dramatized it:

Be it resolved:  
That the Portland Area Council, American Veterans Committee, hereby calls upon the governor, legislature, and the State Board of Higher Education, and other interested officials, bodies, and agencies of the State of Oregon to give immediate consideration to the establishment of a permanent, state-supported lower division college at some safe and appropriate spot in the environs of Portland.

There is a definite need for a priority system in the allocation of permanent housing to families with more than two children. These families will find it more difficult to be placed in any temporary housing and a priority system is needed.
