Miss Marjorie Johnson accompanied them for a vacation in the southern city.

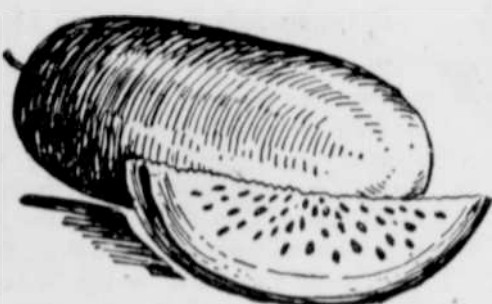
TAKES HOLIDAY

It was decided there would be no more business meetings until September.

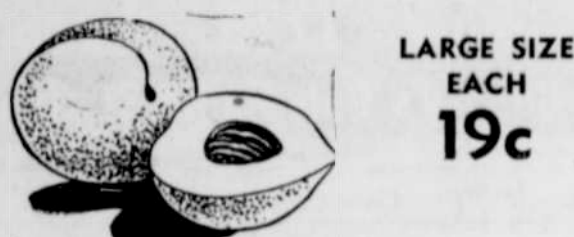
THREE WEEKS AWAY
