Farmers' Union Wants Terms of Office Limited

Apparently striking at the current governmental tradition of political office-holders spending a life-time in one post of public service, the Washington county unit of the Farmer's Educational and Cooperative Union of America calls by resolution for the limitation of tenure for such jobs as are now unrestricted.

A Resolution Whereas: The President of the United States, the Governor, the Secretary of State and the State Treasurer of Oregon have been limited by Law to two consecutive terms in office:

And Whereas: The Membership in our Legislative bodies is of great importance to the preservation of our Democratic form of Government and at the present time there is no limitation on

the number of terms which a member may serve;

Therefore Be It Resolved: By the Washington County Farmer's Union this 19th day of June, 1948, that we actively work for the limitation to two consecutive terms the offices of the County Judge, the County Commissioners, the members of the Oregon Senate and House of Representatives, the members of the United States Senate and the United States House of Representatives.

And Be It Further Resolved: That this Resolution be sent to each Local in Washington County and to the State Convention for action, and that copies be sent to the press and to the Oregon Farmers Union paper at Salem.
