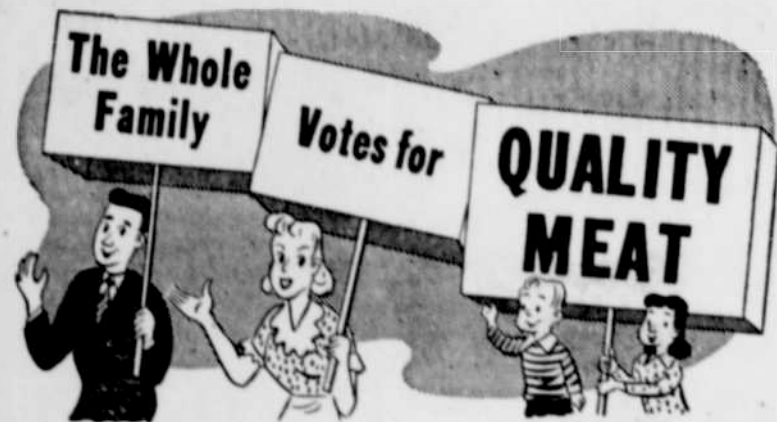

Pioneer Mail Man Passes Away in Portland Oct. 24

Andrew M. Kennedy, pioneer resident of Beaverton, passed away Sunday morning in a Portland hospital. He had lived in Oregon for the past 70 years and in Beaverton for the past 67 years. He was a retired mail carrier and had served from 1906 to 1925.

Mr. Kennedy was born January 29th, 1858 in Somerset County, Maine and he would have been 91 on his next birthday. He was a member of Beaverton Lodge No. 100 AF & AM, Beaver Chapter, OES, Beaverton Grange, Al Kader Shrine, Gul Ressee Grotto and Hillsboro Royal Arch.

Services were held Tuesday, October 26th at 1:30 p.m. in the Masonic Lodge Bldg. in Beaverton under the auspices of the lodge. The Rev. Albert King officiated. Vault interment was in Crescent Grove cemetery.

Survivors include three children: Lancelot A. Kennedy of Beaverton; Hazel B. Goodall of St. Helens, Oregon; Agnes Luchs of Portland; 20 grandchildren and 17 great grandchildren.

Pegg's Mortuary, Beaverton, was in charge of services.

William F. Norman retired manager of the Fairbanks-Morse Co. died Thursday, Oct. 21 at Belleville Sanitarium after an extended illness.

Mr. Norman was born on Sept. 27, 1866 at Stanberry, Mo., and came to Portland in 1912. In 1926 he moved to Woodburn, Oregon where he was president of the Woodburn Bank.

In 1930 they moved to Aloha and Mr. Norman served on the building committee of the Aloha Grange Hall. He and Mrs. Norman were very active in the Grange. He served on the school board of the Aloha-Huber school and was County Chairman of the Red Cross for many years.

Mr. Norman is survived by his widow, Ada W., also of the Belleville Sanitarium and a son Harold of Chicago, Ill. and two grandchildren. The funeral was held Saturday morning at 10 a.m. in the Riverview Abbey Chapel.

BIRD HUNTERS AWAIT OPENING OF SEASONS

The pheasant, quail and water fowl seasons all open at noon on Friday, October 29th. The pheasant season in all open counties except Malheur and the Summer Lake Valley will extend through November 2. In Malheur county the season will extend through November 7. In the Summer Lake Valley, which is being used as a test area by the Game Commission, the season for pheasants will be concurrent with the waterfowl

Bag limits for Ringneck pheasant this year are 2 cocks in any one day and 4 for the season except in Malheur county where the limit is 2 cocks a day and 6 for the season and in the Summer Lake Valley where the bag limit is 2 pheasants of either sex a day and not more than four in possession.

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
