## Soc. Security in Washington Cnty Pays Over 1,000

More than 1,000 persons in Washington County are now receiving benefit payments under the Federal Old-Age and Survivors Insurance program, the Portland office of the Social Security Administration announces. This brings just under \$20,000 a month into the county.

Sixty-eight percent of the old age and survivors insurance benefit payments coming into Washington County are paid to retired workers and their wives. The remainder are going to the families of workers who have died.

Mr. Peebles, manager of the Portland office, pointed out that about one person in ten loses one or more monthly checks by making application late. He suggested that it is wise to check with the Social Security Administration when you are sixty-five, or when someone with a social security card dies.

At the present time the State Association is serving 7 county associations. In addition to the local group, they include Yamhill, Linn-Benton, Coos, Josephine, Marion and Malheur counties.
