Officers for each group will be elected and the study unit text books will be distributed.

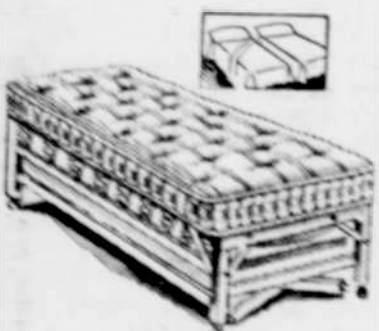
