**AFL Contest For Any Student In Oregon Hi School**

Any student regularly attending a high school in the state of Oregon is eligible to compete in the third annual college scholarship contest sponsored by the Oregon State Federation, according to an announcement from the organization's spokesmen. For the first time since the competition began, three \$500 scholarships will be awarded this year, two of them by the state federation and the third by the joint council of teamsters. Purpose of the scholarship program is the study of the American labor movement's history, the part it plays in the industrial scheme and its effect on the national economy. Dr. Rex Putnam, state superintendent of instruction, has approved the scholarship and commends it to school administrators, it is said. Awards will be made on the basis of a written examination, given simultaneously in high schools throughout the state. Papers will be examined and scored by persons not knowing the student's identity. **CHEVROLET DISPLAYS FULLY RESTYLED MODEL SATURDAY**

OVER MILLION MILES OF RESEARCH PLUS 3 YEARS DEVELOPMENT WORK PRODUCES IMPROVED '49 CAR

A fully restyled model, representing over a million miles of engineering research and some three years of development work, goes on display, Saturday, January 22, in the showrooms of Chevrolet dealers across the nation, according to Gregg Owens of Multnomah. The 1949 model is lower, wider and includes numerous body and chassis improvements for greater comfort, safety and convenience. It is declared. Two series, Fleetline and Styleline, will be offered with deluxe treatment optional in most body types. Fleetline are two and four door sedans with the roof-line extending to the rear in an unbroken sweep. This "fast back", as it is known to the trade, was a popular feature of the 1948 Aerodan. Styleline, in two and four-door sedans, sport coupe, three passenger business coupe, convertible, wood and all-steel station wagons, carry the "notch back", where the curvature of the roof meets the rear deck at the body belt line. Entire passenger compartment of the new cars has been moved forward, lengthened, broadened, and lowered. The front fenders continue on into the body, ending up flush with the doors. Crowns of the fenders have also been raised to fit snugly into the hood and grille ensemble. One of the chief improvements, from a passengers viewpoint, is the increase of glass area. All windows have been deepened and widened. Windshield curves inward at the narrowed pillars to improve sideway as well as forward vision. Gain in visibility over 1948 model is as much as 30%, the company—statement points out. Instead of riding over the rear axle, passengers in the back seat are now positioned between the front and rear axles. Lower-

ing of compartment has reduced the center of gravity of the car, resulting in greater stability on curves and at higher speeds. Front and rear direct double-acting shock absorbers are adopted as a feature for better roadability. The master steering arm has been located in the center of the chassis front end, to equalize the effort of left and right turns. Gear shift is new, with substitution of a manual shift for the former vacuum-assisted mechanism. The gear lever remains on the steering column, but has been lengthened. With omission of the cowl vent, a new means of ventilation draws in fresh air through ducts located between the front fender skirts and the radiator. These ducts lead to tubes ending at the dash. Air is metered by butterfly valves manually operated by the driver. Because there are so many improvements beyond this limited description, the public is invited to see the new model first hand. To be on display at the Chevrolet showrooms on Saturday, January 22.
