### John M. Pitman

John M. Pitman of Route 3, Box 554, passed away at the Jones hospital in Hillsboro on January 12, 1949. Services were held Saturday, January 15th at 3:30 p.m. at the Pegg Chapel, Beaverton with the Rev. Eley Parris of Portland, officiating. Vault interment was in Crescent Grove cemetery.

Mr. Pitman was a well known figure in Washington County and many parts of Oregon. He was born August 16, 1876 in Yamhill County, Oregon on a farm near Chehalem Valley. When grown, he took up barbering and owned three different shops in Portland at various times. In 1913, he was employed by the Southern Pacific Company until 1923 when he met with a bad accident and was forced to discontinue his service with the company.

Then he took up the dairy business and settled on a farm near Tualatin where he lived for 25 years. He then sold the farm and settled on a small acreage near Beaverton where he lived until his death. His wife, Bertha S. Pitman, passed away on July 1, 1948. Mr. Pitman was also known over the state as a dairy co-op booster.

He is survived by three sisters: Mrs. Myrtle N. Meyer of Oswego, Oregon, Mrs. Delpha Brown of Lafayette, Oregon and Mrs. Jane Collins of Escalon, California; also numerous nieces and nephews.
