Carbon Monoxide Hits Motorists Without Warning

No estimate can be made of the number of traffic accidents and deaths attributable to carbon monoxide poisoning, warns the state traffic-safety division in reminding motorists of the deadliness of this invisible, odorless gas.

Tests have shown that carbon monoxide is present in the exhaust fumes of all vehicles, and that even a slight concentration will induce drowsiness and inattention at the wheel. Many accidents in which the driver apparently falls asleep are due to monoxide fumes.

Accumulation of monoxide in the blood is often a slow process, increasing over a period of several hours. Symptoms, such as headache or drowsiness, may be overlooked or ascribed to some other cause. Greatest danger lies in the fact that a victim may lose

consciousness without feeling any of the warning symptoms.

Although dangerous concentrations of monoxide in moving vehicles are usually traceable to defective exhaust systems, the safety division emphasizes that parking with the motor running to keep warm may result in fatal seepage regardless of exhaust system conditions.

To escape the dangers of monoxide, motorists should: 1. Have car checked for exhaust leaks; 2. Be sure car is fitted with tight floor mats; 3. Never run the motor of stationary vehicle to keep warm; 4. Keep one window partly open and 5. Stop for fresh air the instant driver or passenger feels drowsy.
