More Than Half Auto Accidents At Intersections

Drivers who wish to avoid costly repairs on the family automobile will do well to keep a wary eye on intersections. Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry suggested today.

State accident reports show that more than half of all urban mishaps take place where two streets come together. The usual result is an angle collision, frequently fatal and always expensive, the secretary pointed out.

Most of the trouble occurs at intersections not controlled by traffic lights or signs, and most of it could be avoided by either common courtesy or observance of the right of way laws, he declared. Oregon law gives right of way to the driver on the right when two cars are approaching an intersection simultaneously.

"There is an older law which says that two solid objects cannot occupy the same space at the same time," said Newbry. "Applied to modern traffic, it means that stopping in time to avoid a collision is far better than insisting on the right of way regardless of consequences."
