In addition he will supply the pulpit in the absence of the pastor, Rev. H. A. Armitage, do pastoral calling, and will take over the duties of church secretary.

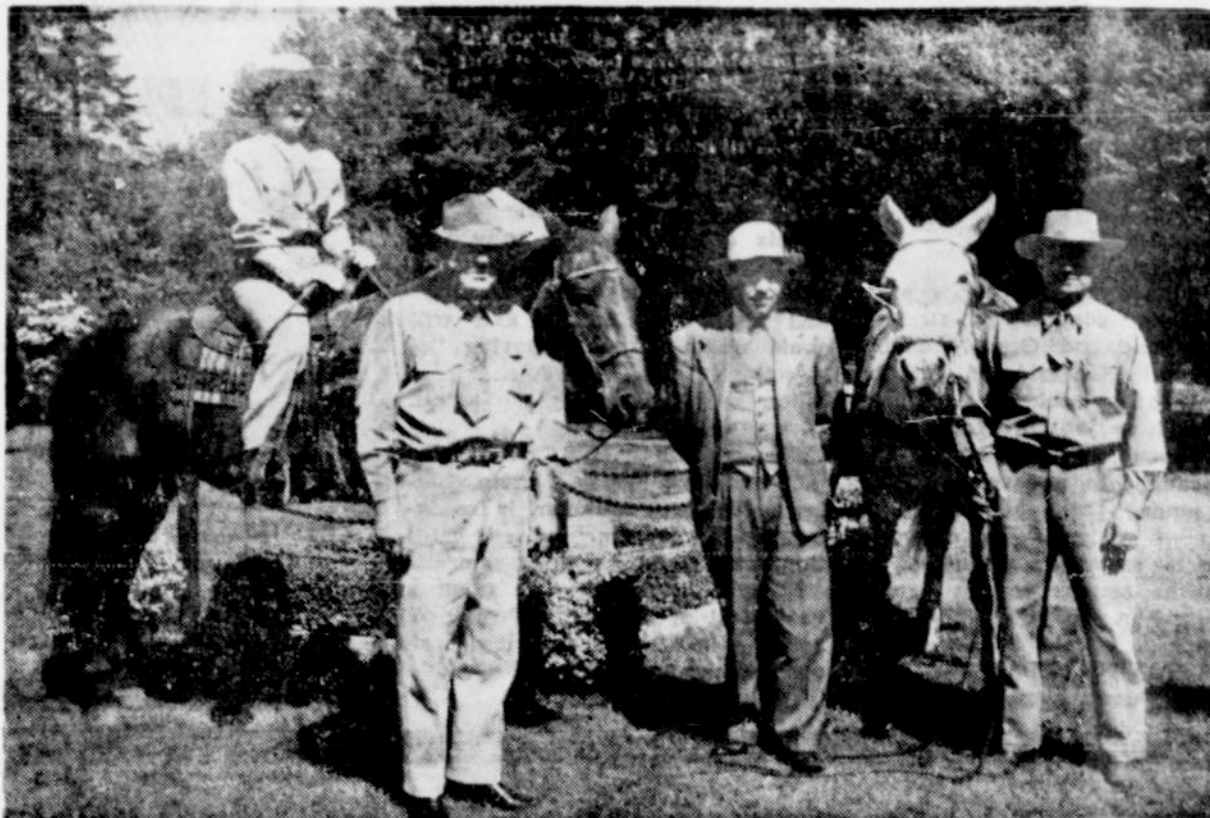

Pfc Prink enlisted on August 22, 1947 and received basic training at Ft. Lewis, Wash. He was sent to Korea in November 1948 and was initially assigned to Hq. Company XXIV Corps. In April, 1948, he was transferred to the 31st Infantry Regiment—often called, "The Foreign Legion of the U. S. Army"—and was assigned to the Regimental Chaplain's Office.

Pfc Prink is a member of the Church Choir and is also organist at the Post Chapel. He plans to continue his education upon separation from the Army.

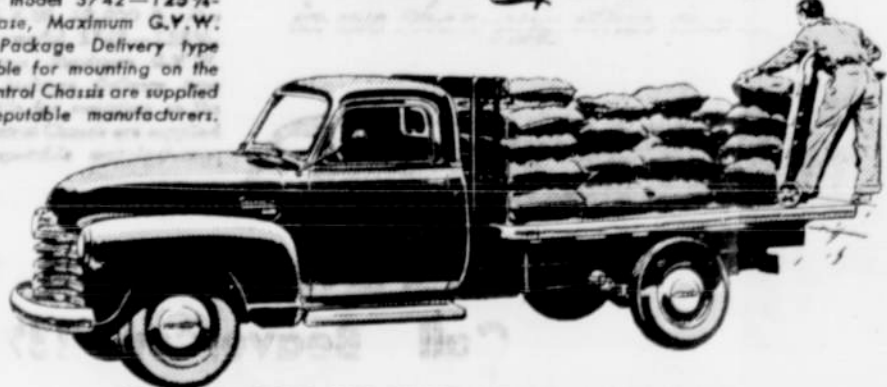
