### Giants Scouting Oregon for New Baseball Talent

DALLAS, Oregon. — Mickey Shader, western scout for the New York Giants National league baseball club, has issued a call for diamond talent to report to a try-out camp in this little Willamette Valley city on August 6 and 7, starting at 10 a. m.

With Hughie Day, another Giant scout, Shader will look over prospects for the Giants as he conducts the camp "in major league style."

This will be one of three such sessions to be held by the Giants in the Northwest this year, the other two to be at locations in Oregon and Washington to be selected.

All players eligible to sign professional contracts may attend without charge, although each must pay his own expenses and bring his own uniform. Games will be played both Saturday and Sunday, and all players will be allowed to participate.

Shader points out that the camp will be strictly a hunt for talent and is not a baseball school, although much instruction will be given. Sessions will be held rain or shine, and on the concluding day, pick of the prospects will meet a top semi-pro outfit of this area in a nine-inning game.
