First Jr. Olympics Set For August 6 At Grant Bowl

The first annual Oregon Junior Olympic games championships under the sponsorship of the Oregon Association, Amateur Athletic Union, will be held at Grant Bowl in Portland, Oregon on August 6. The event which will open at 10 a. m. features contestants from 10 years through 17 years for both boys and girls in standard track and field performances.

Entries have been received from Astoria, Bend, Eugene, Albany, Pendleton, Klamath Falls, Oregon City and Corvallis as well as Portland. Each of these entering cities will be represented by a team chosen from a divisional meet in the local areas. The champions in their respective events will be eligible to compete in the championship in Portland.

Medals for first, second and third places will be presented at the conclusion of each event with each of the top three relay teams receiving individual medals.

The meet is being handled by the recreation departments of the cities listed above and the championships will be conducted by the playground and recreation department of the city of Portland. If you wish to participate in the championships, get in touch with your local recreation director.
