Recruit Upranks To Private By Skill With Gun

WITH THE EIGHTH U. S. ARMY IN TOKYO, JAPAN.—Recruit Russell L. Place, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. L. H. Place, Route 3, Box 438, Beaverton, Oregon, has recently been promoted to the rank of Private for his commendable performance as a rifleman in his unit Company E, 8th Cavalry Regiment. This promotion was announced by the commanding officer of Company E.

Private Place entered the U. S. Army in January, 1949, and received his basic training at Fort Ord, California. Sailing for the Far East Command during April, 1949, he was assigned to the 8th Cavalry Regiment, now on occupation duty in the Tokyo and Yokohama area of Japan.

Game Com. OK's Pheasant Hunts In Wash. County

According to 1949 hunting regulations as released by the Oregon state game commission, nimrods in Washington county will not be required to wander far afield in search of pheasants. Open season in the county has been set from noon, October 21, through October 26.

Bag limits is 2 cock pheasants and not more than 6 during the entire season, for ringnecks, blue and ruffed grouse, bag limit of 2, will be in season from September 1 through 5 in all counties west of the summit of the Cascades.

There is no time limit on silver gray squirrels, in Washington county, with the bag restriction of 5 in possession during the entire year.

Mink, muskrat and otter are in open season from November 15 through February 15, on racoon, from November 15 through October 15, 1950. Marten, fisher, Beaver and ringtail cat season is closed the entire year.

In big game hunting, the general deer season will be from October 1 to October 20, inclusive, in all counties except Sherman, for blacktail and mule deer having not less than forked antlers, and in Douglas county only for white-tail deer having not less than forked antlers. Bag limit is one deer.

General Elk season runs from October 25 to November 3, inclusive, bag limit of one bull elk having antlers with three points or more, including the brow tine. Open area is that portion of Oregon west of highway 97, with the exception of Washington and Tillamook counties and that part of Douglas county east of highway 99.

Bandtail pigeons may be hunted in Washington county from September 1 to 30, inclusive, with bag limit at 8 in any one day, 8 in possession at one time and not more than 24 during the entire season.

A complete synopsis is being prepared by the game commission and as soon as the printing is accomplished should be ready for distribution—probably about September 1.

Posses of State Plan Big Things For Encampment

Washington County Sheriff's Posse riders will be among the expected 300 members of the Oregon association of Mounted Posses to give their mounts a real workout this weekend as they participate in the 2nd annual state posse encampment at Davis Lake, in the Odell district of the Willamette National forest.

Senator Wayne Morris and Governor Douglas McKay, both active in horsemen's organizations, have been sent special invitations. Representatives from Benton, Clackamas, Douglas, Jackson, Josephine, Klamath, Lane, Linn, Tillamook, Washington, Yamhill and Lake county Sheriff's posses, as well as the Oregon Mounted, Salem, and the Clatskanie and Portland Mounted police posses will be on hand.

The arrangement committee, has been working with the Willamette district forest ranger to complete plans for camping and daily horseback treks along forest trails. As well as enjoying two days of horseback recreation, these possesmen are checking the forest trails to make sure they are open and serviceable in case of fire.

During their two days of camping, the posse members will be served food from chuck wagons manned by Lane and Tillamook posse members. Western music and dancing at an improvised pavilion will feature the evening entertainment for the posse members and their wives.
