Tansy ragwort blooms in an attractive yellow color, with each tricity you can get enough heat to blossom from one-half to one inch make a pot of coffee for a full across. The flowers grow in dense, week, on the electric stove or in flat-topped clusters. Leaves are the percolator? flat and are attached directly to the main stem. The plant gives off a highly disagreeable odor, which also helps to identify it.

A perennial plant, its leaves look similar to that of a chrysanthemum and its stem is purplish in color. Seeds spread with the ease of thistles or dandelions. Eradication, when the plant grows in great numbers, is a difficlut and costly process.

Owners of bees not registered are subject to penalties outlined in the Oregon apiary law, which the apiary inspector is charged

Officials feel that with the active cooperation of beekeepers the disease of bees will be reduced to the point so bees may be kept without much danger of losing them from foulbrood.

They stress the fact that bees are needed in this section of the state to pollinize the various seed crops and tree fruits grown and that this phase of the bee industry is even more important financially to the district than the honey produced.


