## Experts Endorse Mix of Legumes And Grass Cover

A cover crop including a cereal and a legume seeded together will provide more green material than either seeded alone and will have added insurance against crop failure, states Arthur S. King, OSC soil conservation specialist, who adds that winter cover crops are a necessary part of good soil management.

The grain in the mixture provides the most dependable cover. Legumes are sometimes killed by extreme weather, pests or disease, the specialist points out.

To qualify as a "good" cover crop, however, the mixture must make an early fall growth to provide a cover during cold winter weather and produce a heavy tonnage of green material to be plowed under early in the spring.

Clean-cultivated orchards, commercial vegetable land, hopyards, and berry plantings are all examples of land that will profit by the protection afforded by a growing cover crop during the late fall, winter and early spring months. Cover crops are a source of organic matter and will prevent fertility losses through leaching.

On soils with low fertility and where legumes have been unsuccessful, King recommends use of Abruzzi rye as a cover crop. In addition to a heavy seeding, he suggests use of fall and spring applications of nitrogen fertilizer.

Where possible it is also recommended that a drill be used to insure a thick, even cover stand. Added cover in orchards will be provided if the tree rows are drilled both ways. The specialist also urges "across slope" drilling to prevent soil erosion.

Rough, cloddy soil surfaces will aid water penetration and reduce erosion until the crop has a chance to become established. Soil that has been left rough in the fall will be much easier to work next spring as compared with soil that is worked down to a packed, fine mulch.

## Deer Hunters Lag In Mailing Tags Telling of Kills

Deer hunters' report card returns are lagging behind last year it was announced today by the Oregon State Game Commission. Almost three thousand cards had been mailed into the Portland office of the commission first week time, but more than three times that many had been returned after the first week of the 1948 season. All hunters who purchase a deer tag are required to send in the completed return card. This must be done whether a kill is made or not and whether the tag buyer hunts or not.

Early returns always run high in kills as those hunters not having made a kill usually wait until the close of the season before reporting. To date out of 2,965 returns 2,938 have been reports of kills. Lake, Deschutes, Klamath, and Tillamook Counties lead the list of kills at this time.

Mr. C. A. Lockwood, Oregon State Game Director, stated that he hoped the Oregon hunters would continue the fine cooperation in making these returns that was evident last year. The returns in 1948 in Oregon were as high as any state has ever had. Lockwood also pointed out that the law allows the Commission to refuse tags the following year to any hunter who fails to make a report. He also stated that administrative machinery has now been set up which will enable the Commission to cross check these returns.

"I feel certain that the hunters in Oregon want to cooperate in furnishing this needed information," Lockwood said, "and I certainly hope that it will not be necessary to refuse future deer tags to hunters failing to report."
