Hundred Ask PUC For Hookup With New Bus Service

Approximately 100 Beaverton business and professional men and women affixed their signatures to the petition circulated last week by Thurlow Weed, local attorney, urging the Public Utilities Commission to order any bus or stage company obtaining a franchise in the McLain Village—Marlene Village—Cedar Hills area to place downtown Beaverton upon the bus route.

No bus service is furnished Beaverton and Beaverton at the present time, while inadequate bus service is being furnished between Cedar Hills section and Beaverton.

In a letter accompanying the petition, Weed urged the Public Utilities Commission to make a full investigation and survey of the need for transportation between the rapidly growing residential area and its nearest large trading center.

It is believed that a minimum of two bus trips each morning, two trips each afternoon, and two trips each evening is needed to afford adequate transportation facilities to the travelling public.

The need for united support of Beaverton Business men in bringing the facts before the Public Utilities Commission arose when it was learned that a franchise-seeking company proposed to run its bus route through the residential area and then on Sunset Highway to Portland, approaching no closer to Beaverton than a mile to the north.
