Beaverton High Begins Classes Adult Education

Adult Education classes start Monday, January 9, 1950, at the Beaverton Union High School. The following classes will be offered: Home Sewing, Tailoring, Upholstering, Typing and Woodworking.

Upholstering is held Monday afternoons from one to four o'clock. The other classes begin at 7:00 p. m. Monday evenings.

All those who plan to enter adult education classes for the second term should enroll Monday, January 9, as this will be counted as the first meeting of the ten weeks' course. The term will end March 13.

A minimum enrollment of fifteen is required for the typing and woodworking classes. These classes will be cancelled if this number does not enter on or before January 9. There will not be a millinery class offered at this time as no instructor is available. If it is possible to obtain a teacher later, notices will be published.

The high school hopes enough interest will be shown by the people of the community to warrant continuing these classes.

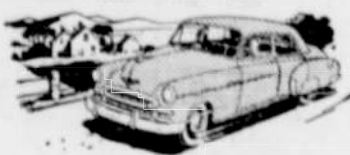
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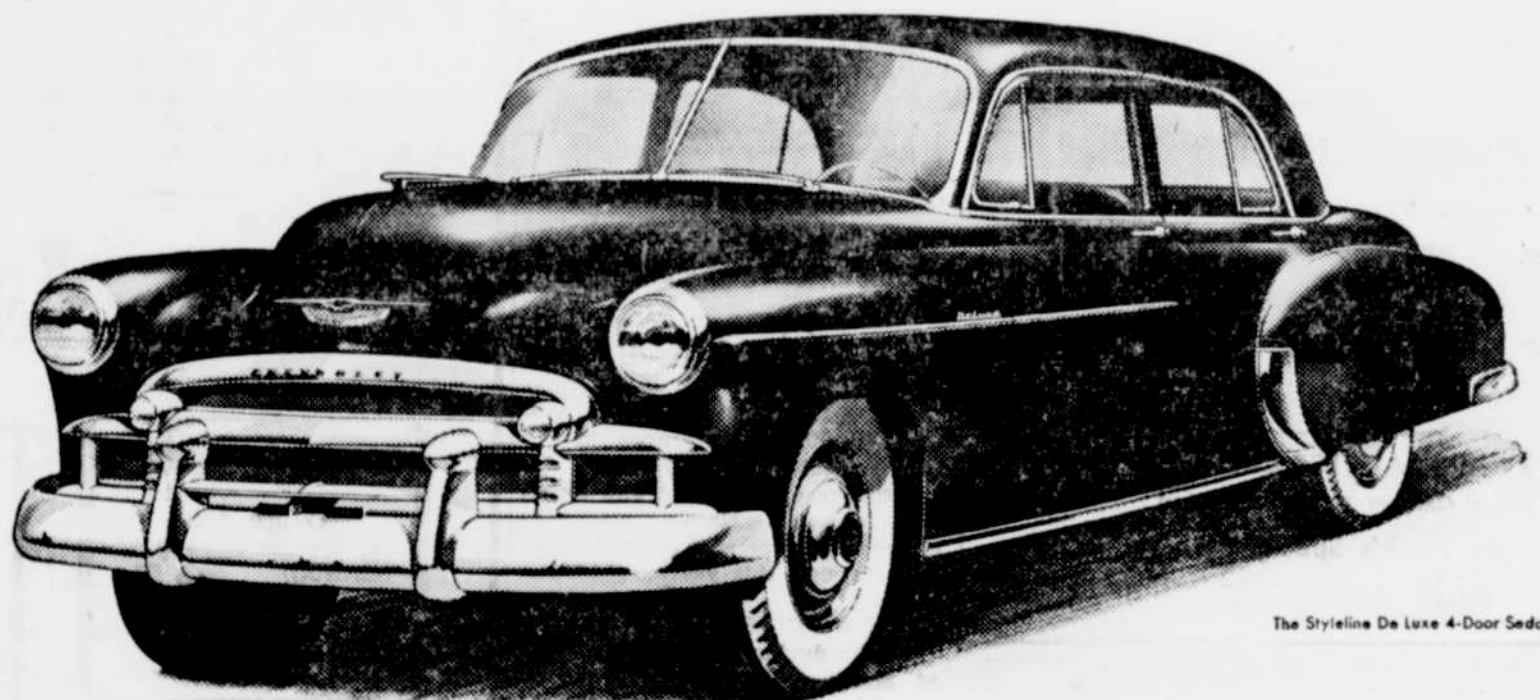
